

# Nursery Remote Learning Activities


## Mathematics

<p>Using any household item, ask your child to give you a specific number of objects.</p> <p>“Can you give me 3 blocks?”</p> <p>Focus on 1-5 items and counting object at a time.</p>	<p>You will need 5 teddies/trains/spoons/ pieces of pasta or any household item for this activity.</p> <p>Line up a number of objects (up to 5) and ask your child to count how many there are. Can they count with 1-1 correspondence? Try putting them into irregular arrangements. Can they count them now?</p>	<p>Write the numbers 1-5 on separate pieces of paper.</p> <p>Ask your child if they recognise any of the digits and discuss the ones they are not familiar with. Can you trace them with your finger?</p> <p>Place them out on the floor and ask the children to jump on/next to specific numbers.</p>

## English/Phonics

<p>What’s in the book?</p> <p>Read a favourite picture book with your child. Once you have finished the story, explore the pictures with your child – ask them what they can see in the book. Discuss what is happening and explore feelings.</p>	<p>Musical Statues</p> <p>Explain to your child that when they hear the music stop they must freeze like a statue!</p> <p>Are they able to respond quickly?</p>	<p>Tuning into sound</p> <p>Have 3 or 4 items that make different sounds (rice in a jar, two blocks)</p> <p>Explore the different sounds and them hide then in a bag/under a sheet. Make the noise. Can your child identify the sound?</p>

<p>Using the whiteboard in your home learning pack, ask your child to copy the pre-writing shapes. Be aware of / support correct pencil grip.</p> 	<p>Draw a picture of my family.</p> <p>Discuss with your children who is in their family.</p> <p>Can they draw a family picture? Notice features of the face/body and discuss what they might need.</p>	<p>Make a junk model of your favourite animal. How could you join the pieces together? Tape, glue? How are you going to decorate your animal?</p> <p>Will you use pens, pencils, paint, collage?</p>
